

Updates from the Dawson Park / Kinnaird Ravine Sub-Committee

- After two months, we have heard back from Scott McKeen's office with some information on the Park Plan process.
 - They provided us with a rough draft budget that totals \$26.9 million "(+/- 50%)."
 - They gave us a list of factors that contribute to the identification of parks for concept planning; they acknowledge that "community/public interest" is not one of the factors that contributed to the selection of Dawson Park / Kinnaird Ravine. Factors that did contribute included "level of strategy-level guidance available for the area"; "level of development adjacent to the facility"; and "site-specific challenges that could be addressed through infrastructure." We

do not know what these site-specific challenges are but planners emphasized in a past meeting that homelessness is not an issue the park plan is addressing.

- We have received further letters of support for a pause and further engagement from Rosedale community league and a U of A graduate student whose research has focused on the need for park planning to consider the needs of vulnerable populations.
- The subcommittee will soon be preparing a brief for Scott McKeen to share with other councillors.



News from the Riverdale City Owned Property Committee

At its April 30th meeting the Executive Committee of City Council considered a Report submitted by City Administration with regards to City Owned Property in Riverdale. The report was required pursuant to an inquiry initiated by Councillor Scott McKeen after meeting with the League's City Owned Property Committee last December. The Committee alerted

Eight Riverdalians, including four representatives of the League and its City Owned Property Committee, made oral presentations to the Executive Committee on April 30th. A representative developer of non-profit affordable housing, Cam MacDonald (Right at Home), also spoke.

The members of the Executive Committee had also been sent copies

Following these presentations, as well as presentations by and dialogue with representatives of the City Administration, the Executive Committee passed the following Motion (from the Draft Minutes of the April 30th meeting of the Executive Committee meeting, on the City of Edmonton website):

Affordable Housing on City-owned Site in Riverdale
That Administration provide a report on options and feasibility for affordable housing, in consultation with the community and affordable housing providers, on the Riverdale City-owned site outlined in the April 30, 2018, Financial and Corporate Services report CR_5600.

According to the Draft Minutes the Motion is directed to the City's Financial and Corporate Services department, and is "Due by: Nov. 15, 2018"

Given that affordable housing is a priority Edmonton City Council at this time, we expect the Administration to approach its task under the Motion with serious integrity. The League's City Owned Property Committee is committed to do our utmost, working with Riverdalians, to ensure that the requirement of the Motion (the examination of options and feasibility for redevelopment of the properties for affordable housing in consultation with the community and providers) are carried out as robustly, democratically, fairly and transparently as possible.

Councillor McKeen that the Administration was advising us they were about to sell certain City owned properties in Riverdale, whereas our ARP requires consideration of these properties for redevelopment for affordable housing, also stated as requiring examination of the feasibility of such redevelopment.

The presentations of the City Owned Property Committee were in furtherance of the Committee's mandate "to ensure and participate in carrying out an examination of the

feasibility of redeveloping City-owned properties in Riverdale for affordable housing." (From Item 8 in the Minutes of the Riverdale Community League meeting of September 11, 2017, "City owned properties in Riverdale: Motion to form an ad hoc committee for opportunities for low income housing.")

beauty of the world around me. Celebrate it all.


Chase my tail. Roll in the grass or snow. Just jump for the joy of jumping or running.

Physically and psychologically safe in Riverdale

I remember the night I moved to Riverdale. My daughter and I had driven from Calgary with the last of our belongings, to join my husband in our new home. It was close to midnight on a warm August night. Excited to see the renovated basement, we ran into the house, leaving the car doors wide open. When we returned minutes later, a cardboard box was gone from the car. It contained important personal documents and our wedding album, not the DVD player pictured on the outside. That night I barely slept as thoughts how to recover or replace the missing items raced through my mind. Early the next morning a loud knock on the front door woke us up - Mike from two doors down stood there with the box and asked, "Is this yours?" He had found the box dumped in his front yard and had recognized Markus on the wedding pictures.

This story symbolizes life in Riverdale for me.

First there is the learning curve involved in moving to a neighbourhood close to downtown. Don't leave your car unlocked, and DON'T leave the doors wide open! Don't leave any valuables in the car. Lock your garage. Lock your doors. Maybe install motion sensor lighting. And so on. It's kind of sad we need to do this. But I remember the sense of violation I felt when that box was gone. Many of you have experienced something similar. As we enter summer, I expect an increase in incidents reported on "Engaging Riverdalian" (Facebook), as over the past few years. So here's a heads-up: Secure your home, car, yard. And report every incident to the police. The amount of police attention a neighbourhood receives is based on the number and type of reported incidents.

Thankfully, overall Riverdale is relatively safe. EPS crime stats from January 2016 to mid-May 2018 show that we had mostly property crimes: 67 break & enter (23+39+5), 75 theft from vehicle (37+27+11), 9 theft of vehicle (3+5+1), 1 theft over \$5000 (0+1+0), as well as 4 robberies (3+1+0), 18 assaults (9+7+2), and 2 sexual assaults (1+1+0), for a total of 176 reported crimes. For comparison, McCauley had over 1200 reported crimes

in the same period, Downtown had over 2500, and Ritchie 436. (I did not find stats on the ratio of incidents to population for each neighbourhood.)

But it's not only security measures and the police that create safety. The second thing the story of my first 24 hours in Riverdale shows is the crucial role of neighbours in safety. It was our neighbour Mike who found and returned the stolen box. In a similar incident, I met my neighbour Ryan - in my pajamas - after I managed to stop a theft from his car that I had witnessed while eating breakfast. We often hear of "eyes on the street" and I guess it's true! But it's more than just eyes: Neighbours who know each other create a safer, more resilient community.

I am now talking about psychological safety. Do my words, tone and body language make my neighbour feel safe and accepted, or threatened and diminished? Have I, perhaps unwittingly, participated in group shaming? A while ago I saw a Facebook post where some justified outrage about criticism of a mom turned into group shaming of the perpetrator as more and more people (who were not present in the original situation) chimed in with their opinions. How do I appropriately express my disagreement or frustration with my neighbour? How neighbourly am I when I voice my opinion on social media or in person? As league president I want to thank you for being mindful of how your

A while ago when there was a serious emergency on my block, our existing network of relationships sprang into action. I went to babysit the neighbour kids, so that their dad could attend to the emergency. Because we all knew and trusted each other, we were able to coordinate and act quickly. Another example is the fundraising events that have happened in Riverdale over the years for various neighbours in crisis. What a wonderful thing for a community to do! But it requires relationships, because without them we don't know about a crisis or don't have the interest or resources to help.

This brings me to my last point about safety. In order for relationships to grow, we need to be mindful of the way we

actions affect others. We have had some contentious issues at the league recently, but I was very impressed with the overall respectful and civil tone at meetings. I want our face-to-face meetings and our Facebook group always to be safe places. This does not mean absence of opinions or debate, appropriately expressed.

We all benefit from a safe neighbourhood. So let's keep improving physical and psychological safety in Riverdale. I am on that journey with you.

Faith and I met about 10 years ago. What struck me about that first date was that we both arrived in hybrid cars. She in a first generation hybrid Civic and me hot rodding in a blue Prius. I did not realize how prescient that moment was for both of us. Now almost 10 years later, after much discussion over a couple of years, we have installed a Photo voltaic system on our home in Riverdale on 89th Street.

There are lots of reasons for now considering solar panels on your home. PV certainly will reduce your carbon footprint over time. There are some hefty provincial rebates to consider that may go away too soon. New programs seem to be rolling out all the time! The technology keeps improving too, so now is a good time to start the conversation.

It can lead to some unexpected benefits as well. The local company we chose, Evergreen & Gold, employs a resident of Riverdale who last year installed solar on his garage. It was nice to have coffee with Ron Kelly as he started each work day. It also seems that this choice will lead to new educational opportunities as we try to fully understand the system and its implication on our lifestyle. I especially like having a knowledgeable neighbour that I can share numbers with and ask a million questions.

One of the justifications Faith articulated was based on our entering retirement and living on a fixed income. She understood that utility costs will keep rising and that solar panels would help preserve our cashflow even if the upfront costs pinched a bit. She's the numbers person in our household for a good reason.

It has been exciting in the last weeks to have neighbors walk by and ask about the system. If you're in the area walking by, stop and take a look above our front porch. Maybe we can even have a coffee and discuss the benefits of solar. Did I mention that I roast my own coffee?



Pit Bull Attack in Riverdale

On Sunday, April 15th at 12:30 pm I was walking my friendly Weimaraner female dog, Bella, when a large Pit Bull-type dog and a smaller brown Pit Bull came running towards us. The larger white dog was growling as he approached us and suddenly and viciously attacked my Bella. Bella was on a leash. The dog bit Bella in the throat and neck and would not let go. The dog wrestled Bella to the ground and continued the attack, not letting go of her neck. I did everything I could to pull this dog off. Bella was screaming and losing blood. A young couple, who were associated with the two dogs, came upon the scene, but could not help. Finally, after about three minutes the Pit Bull let go and the two dogs followed the young couple home to 92nd

Street. Bella had a huge hole the size of a softball on her neck, several lacerations and was hemorrhaging from her left eye. I rushed her to the Emergency Vet Clinic where she was worked on for about two hours. My primary concern was for Bella's life. I was also presented with a bill for \$906. I rent and live on an old-age pension and cannot afford this. I put the vet bill on my MasterCard. If you are the owner of these dogs or a witness to this attack, please call me at 780-983-7703 (my son, Tony's phone number). Thank you. There seems to be a recent increase of this Pit Bull type of breed in Riverdale so be careful when walking your dog.

Are You Paying Too Much for Your Mortgage?
